



STANDARDS COMMISSION FOR SCOTLAND BRITISH SIGN LANGUAGE PLAN

DRAFT PLAN CONSULTATION JULY 2018

The following is the draft British Sign Language Plan for the Standards Commission for Scotland (Standards Commission), produced in accordance with the British Sign Language (Scotland) Act 2015.

The Plan outlines the actions the Standards Commission intends to take before 2024 to improve access to information and services for BSL users.

A BSL version of the draft Plan is available on the Standards Commission's website at www.standardscommissionscotland.org.uk and on Facebook.

The Standards Commission invites anyone with any queries, comments or suggestions about the draft Plan to submit these before 7 September 2018 so that these can be considered before a final version is produced and published in both English and BSL in October 2018.

The Standards Commission will use any information provided to help to develop its BSL Plan. The Standards Commission will also use the contact details of anyone who responds to keep them informed about the progress of the Plan but only if the individual tells us that want us to do so. The Standards Commission will store any responses securely until it publishes the final BSL Plan and will then then delete it.

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 This is the British Sign Language Plan for the Standards Commission for Scotland (Standards Commission), produced in accordance with the British Sign Language (Scotland) Act 2015.

1.2 In preparation of its Plan, the Standards Commission has had regard to the published National Plan. It also has had regard to:

- the extent to which its functions are exercisable using British Sign Language (BSL);
- the potential for developing the use of BSL in the exercise of its functions;
- any representations made to it in relation to the use of BSL;
- such guidance, relevant to the preparation (or revision) of Authority Plans, as may be issued by the Scottish Ministers.

- 1.3 The Plan outlines the actions the Standards Commission will take between 2018 and 2023 to improve access to information and services for BSL users. It was developed with input from the Scottish Parliament and other parliamentary officeholders and from feedback gathered from Deaf and Deafblind BSL users.
- 1.3 The Standards Commission will publish a progress report in 2020. It will review the Plan at that stage and revise and reissue it as necessary to include any further actions to be taken by 2024.
- 1.4 Any reference in this Plan to 'BSL users' includes Deaf and/or Deafblind people (those who receive the language in a tactile form due to sight loss), whose first or preferred language is BSL.

2. ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN

Scottish Public Services

- 2.1 The Standards Commission shares the long-term goal, as outlined in the BSL National Plan, which is that information and services across all public sector organisations in Scotland will be accessible to BSL users.
- 2.2 To support this, the Standards Commission will:
 - Consult with the BSL community about the role and functions of the Standards Commission;
 - Adopt suggestions and best practice guidelines where possible;
 - Provide information in BSL video format for the BSL community on the Standards Commission's website and social media pages on:
 - how to contact the Standards Commission, including how to make an enquiry and how to provide feedback
 - The Standards Commission's role and remit
 - The ethical standards framework in general
 - How to make a complaint about a breach of a Code of Conduct
 - Ensure all Standards Commission staff receive BSL awareness training;
 - Promote the use of the Scottish Government's nationally funded BSL online interpreting video relay service 'contactSCOTLAND-BSL', which allows BSL users to contact public and third sector services and for these services to contact them; and
 - Make appropriate access arrangements and adjustments for BSL users who, as officers, councillors or members of devolved public bodies, attend the Standards Commission's training and outreach events.

Justice / Democracy

- 2.3 The Standards Commission shares the long-term goal, as outlined in the BSL National Plan, for BSL users to have fair and equal access to the civil justice systems in Scotland and to be fully involved in democratic and public life in Scotland, as active and informed citizens, as voters, as elected politicians and as board members of public bodies.
- 2.4 The Standards Commission will:
- Take steps to ensure details about the Hearings to be held and the procedures to be followed at Hearings are accessible to BSL users;
 - Respond promptly to requests from BSL users about interpretation facilities and access during the Standards Commission's public Hearings when required; and
 - Make appropriate access arrangements and adjustments for BSL users who are parties to, or witnesses at, Hearings.

3. TIMESCALES AND CONTACT DETAILS

- 3.1 The Standards Commission will review this Plan in 2020 and report on the progress made against the actions outlined previously. The Standards Commission will seek and use feedback to further develop the Plan and identify any further steps or actions to be taken before 2024.
- 3.2 The Standards Commission welcomes comments on the Plan.
